Residents Invited to Put Their Mark on New Crestline Library

CRESTLINE – San Bernardino County Second District Supervisor Paul Biane invites residents to sign a steel beam that will become part of the new Crestline Library during an event on Saturday, Nov. 14.

“This is a great opportunity for residents of all ages to put their mark on their new library,” Biane said. “I can picture parents – years from now – reading to their children at the new library and telling them about how their name and perhaps their parents’ names are on a beam somewhere within the library walls.”

The beam signing event will take place from 10 a.m. to noon at the site of the new Crestline Library located at 24105 Lake Gregory Dr. next to the Crestline Village/Skate Park and across from Lake Gregory Regional Park. A light breakfast and refreshments will be served. Indelible pens will also be provided. Residents are invited to stay for a brief ceremony and the lifting of the beam shortly after noon.

The new 7,641 square-foot Crestline Library will include a multipurpose room, children’s reading area, computer lab, and study areas. The existing Crestline Library is located in a 3,169 square-foot building the County leases. The building – a former U.S. Post Office – has been home to the Crestline Library for more than 20 years.

The new library will be built to the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) silver standard. LEED buildings utilize less energy and water than traditional buildings. This will reduce utility costs for the facility while also conserving resources.
